Bring the BLUE candidates (below) to the attention of voters. Inform about them in all the ways you can. Invite the candidates—all 3 of them, or 1 at a time—to various precinct or Area events. As a Precinct Captain, you are neutral. You do not officially favor or endorse anyone. (As a private citizen, not wearing your PC hat, that is a different matter. And Caucuses have different rules. The SCDP hopes for no endorsements before the Primary.)

Clue: Dems are BLUE. R's are RED. But it's a non-partisan, so candidates are not identified by party on the ballot

2 At-Large Seats on August 23 ballot—All precincts vote

A 5-way race for 2 At-Large seats. All Sarasota City voters vote for 2 in the August Primary, with run off in November. This is confusing!

In the case of an election that includes four or more candidates, the city conducts what it terms a "first election," which is scheduled for Aug. 23, coinciding with primary elections for

a variety of countywide offices. The three candidates with the most votes in August advance to the general election, in which the top two vote-getters are declared the winners.
